Uniform with the nursery logo is now available from 'Yorbrand' (just near Aldi) to order. They are able to provide polo tops, jumpers, cardigans and also fleece jackets and coats. Please remember that uniform is entirely optional. Nursery colours are red and navy.

## Keeping everyone safe.....

- We are operating two 'bubbles' within nursery, each with separate entrances (please see your letter if you are unsure which entrance you are going to, or give us a ring)
- Our full risk assessment will be available on our website once finalized
- We will have enhanced cleaning and handwashing procedures in place
- We will be maximizing the use of outdoor spaces every day, whatever the weather
- We ask you to help us by not gathering at school entrances and observing social distancing whilst waiting
- Please DO NOT send your child to nursery if they are unwell.
- If anyone in your house shows any symptoms of COVID-19, please book a test (see below)

- Please ensure your child's pack up is easy to eat picnic style!
- We are currently unable to heat any food
- Please opt for tube yoghurts / squeezy yoghurts rather than pots
- Please name lunchboxes and drinks bottles

- We are a **NUT FREE** nursery. Any products that contain nuts will be returned to you

# Things to do at home...

Please talk positively about things that your child has been doing and make time to look at photographs together and for your child to talk. Please send pictures into us too. This really helps with transition.

Although your key person will be tucked away inside nursery, they will be doing everything they can to ensure your child feels happy and secure. If you would like to speak to them, please telephone and we can arrange this at any time.

#### NHS track and trace

We have a duty as a school to ensure that staff members and parents/carers understand that they will need to be ready and willing to:

- book a test <u>(https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-getting-tested</u>) if they or their child are displaying symptoms.
- Staff and pupils must not come into the school if they have symptoms, and must be sent home to selfisolate if they develop them in school.
- All children can be tested, including children under 5, but children aged 11 and under will need to be helped by their parents/carers if using a home testing kit.
- provide details of anyone they or their child have been in close contact with if they were to test positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) or if asked by NHS Test and Trace
- self-isolate (<u>https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-stay-at-home-guidance/stay-at-homeguidance-for-households-with-possible-coronavirus-covid-19-infection</u>) if they have been in close contact with someone who tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), or if anyone in their household develops symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19)
